BOARD OF DIRECTORS

BOARD OF DIRECTORS: the two year term of the SSET Voting Board of Directors shall be composed of enough Directors, when combined with the Executive Committee, represents an odd number of those who vote. The elected Director must be able to attend in person the Annual Board Meeting and assist with planning and executing with the annual meeting itself.

The affairs of the Chapter are managed by its Board of Directors.

The Board of Directors are subject to restrictions and obligations set forth in the SSET Bylaws.

Directors do not receive compensation for their services but may be reimbursed for expenses.

The Board of Directors shall be responsible for the following, **(complete list in the bylaws)**

- a. study determination, and execution of the short-term and long-range plans of the Chapter for the continued growth, and financial stability of the Chapter.
- b. development of policies and periodic assessment of the needs of the membership.
- c. participation in societies activities such as website updates, vendor representative, Delta Recorder composition and editing and other requests by the EC.
- d. approval of committee chair and other appointees within the bylaws.

ELIGIBILITY:

- a. ACTIVE members in good standing of the Chapter.
- b. ACTIVELY engaged in the practice (clinical, research, or education) of electroneurodiagnostics or neurophysiology within six (6) months preceding their installation.
- c. not a member of an executive committee of another society
- d. sign SSET's conflict of interest form

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This conflict of interest (COI) DOCUMENT is designed to protect the integrity of the society itself and its educational offerings to its membership.

This DOCUMENT applies to faculty at any SSET educational offering, those who serve on the SSET Board of Directors/ Executive Committee, committees, and task forces, or in any volunteer in an official capacity for SSET.

Conflicts of interest occur in all industries and they do not automatically mean that you are prohibited to speak or serve the society. Once a conflict is disclosed the SSET board will weigh its possible influence and direct you further.

Examples of possible COI:

- financial interest/relationship/ownership in an entity that could influence subject matter presented
- financial interest/relationship/ownership that could influence actions or decisions in a leadership role
- other possible conflicts of interest that could influence actions or decisions on behalf of SSET
- fees for referral/use of particular equipment or employment
(see Federal Statute on Anti- Kickback Provisions);
